Strategic Command Admiral Praises Navy's Choice of C-130J for TACAMO Mission

ARLINGTON, Va. — The admiral in charge of the nation's strategic nuclear deterrent forces has praised the Navy's decision to acquire the C-130J-30 Super Hercules aircraft as a platform for communicating with its deployed ballistic-missile submarine force. Four decades ago, the Navy was using earlier C-130 versions — built by Lockheed — for the same mission.

"The Navy is fully capable of supporting my mission requirements to ensure survivable communications to the

ballistic-missile submarines and I think they're making a great decision to go to the C-130," said Adm. Charles Richard, commander, U.S. Strategic Command, speaking in a Jan. 5 webinar to the Defense Writers Group, in response to a reporter's question.

The communications role is called TACAMO by the Navy — a term meaning "Take Charge and Move Out" — has been performed for three decades by the service's Boeing E-6 Mercury aircraft, a variant of the Boeing 707 airliner. After the Cold War, the Airborne National Command Post role previously performed by Air Force EC-135 "Looking Glass" aircraft was incorporated into the E-6 with the installation of the Airborne Launch Control System (ALCS), combining the TACAMO and ALCS in one platform.

The Navy has performed the TACMO mission since 1963, beginning with four C-130G (later EC-130G) Hercules aircraft, later augmented by eight newer EC-130Q Hercules. The E-6 replaced the EC-130s, giving the two TACAMO squadrons, VQ-3 and VQ-4, a faster, quieter, more comfortable platform for the long missions.

The TACAMO aircraft are equipped with a long trailing wire antenna used to relay very-low-frequency radio messages to submerged ballistic-missile submarines. The airframes go through considerable stress as they maintain high angle of bank for long periods to maintain tight orbits to wind the trailing-wire antenna into a vertical position, needed for the radio waves to penetrate the water most effectively.


The Request for Information issued on Dec. 18 by the Naval Air Systems Command's TACAMO Program Office (PMA-271) announced that the Navy "intends to negotiate and award sole-source contracts to Lockheed

Martin Corporation, Marietta, [Georgia], for the efforts associated with the procurement of up to three C-130J-30 "Stretch" green airframes in [fiscal 2022/2023] for testing and analysis.

The C-130J is the current, much more modern version of the C-130 and is flown by the Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard, as well as many foreign air forces. The C-130J-30 is similar but has a 15-foot-longer fuselage. The rugged C-130J is able to operate from many more airfields than the current E-6B Mercury.

"Lockheed Martin Corporation is the sole designer, developer, and manufacturer of the C-130J-30 and is the only source capable of producing the C-130J and derivative aircraft and providing support equipment, logistics support, defensive systems services, and engineering services," the Navy's announcement said. "The Analysis of Alternatives results indicated that the four-engine, militarized C-130J-30 is optimally configured aircraft for performing the TACAMO The characteristics of this airframe also mission. maximize the operational deployability of the assets to austere environments. The C-130 is currently extensively fielded within the Department of Defense, and deployed at various bases that create operation, training and logistics support synergies for TACAMO execution. Lockheed Martin already has an established domestic production line that has the ability to produce test units for PMA271 that will enable acceleration of the risk reduction and subsequent engineering and manufacturing development test program."




TACAMO ROOM UPDATE



Pax River Museum - TACAMO Room

A Maryland Heritage Areas Authority (MHAA) Exhibits Phase II grant project will enable TCVA to properly complete the TACAMO room museum gallery renovations. These renovations include installing the following items: new overhead LED exhibit lighting; new electrical systems including new breaker panels, wiring, and receptacles; new wall finishes where required; multiple new battery-powered emergency lights; making the doorway openings ADA compliant; patching the walls where needed and painting; and installing a new epoxy floor surface in all the rooms. Three contractors have been selected, one for the electrical work/lighting installation, one for the construction work, and one for the flooring preparation and installation.

EC-130Q Bulb Holders NEEDED - TACAMO Veteran & Volunteer, Ron Bremer is repairing and rehabilitating an EC-130Q Generator Panel for the TACAMO display. Right Person....Right Time..... Right Challenge....SUCCESS

"To each there comes in their lifetime a special moment when they are figuratively tapped on the shoulder and offered the chance to do a very special thing, unique to them and fitted to their talents. When he seizes it, it will fulfill his mission — a mission for which he is uniquely qualified. In that moment, he finds greatness. It is his finest hour." Sir Winston Churchill.

TACAMO's history is full of folks who came along at just that right moment to help the community move ahead toward success. The list is long but just a few examples can be found among our Hall of Famers, Walt Reese, Ron Carlson, Ed Preston, Barry Coyle, Andy Riddile, John Kilroy, Bulldog Filz, Billy Depasquale, Jim Meppelink, Deb Martin, Phil Miller, Mickey DiPasquo, and Roger Kilgore. In these and other cases the situation required unique talent and experience and somehow that person was there to make that significant contribution at the very moment it was needed. But it's not always just fate or a happy accident. Sometimes the person just listened to the hints coming from somewhere and made up their minds to "Just Do It!"

Skippers change out about every year or so as do Command Master Chiefs, but NAVAIR Program Managers for TACAMO, the organization known as PMA-271, is about a 3-year commitment and has not millions but billions of dollars associated with the execution of programs designed to underwrite the success of operations. Two gents assigned duty as PMA-271 carefully planned and executed their careers to ensure they were positioned and qualified to make a difference for TACAMO. With their permission, here's Part One of the story of how they came with the RIGHT STUFF at the right time.

When TACAMO was still in 'elementary' school in the early 70s, there was a need for someone who knew electronics and aerodynamics to help pioneer two trailing wire antenna maneuvers. Three VQ-4 Skippers each had an assignment for then LT Ed Hampshire that would build up his expertise AND the community body of knowledge (GOUGE). Skipper "Chick" Wilson sent Ed to work on the TAC IVB development flights which continued later under Skipper Don Kellermam. Later still, Ed led the Verdin development flights that successfully integrated Verdin into the TAC IVB suite under Skipper Bruce Cloud. In Ed's words: "My undergraduate degree was in Electronic Engineering and they thought it might help with the

mountain of difficulties the squadron was having with the new TACAMO III birds. When it became time to start test flying the new TACAMO IVB prototype aircraft, I was assigned to do the flying/testing out of the Addison, TX airport. It was during this time that I thought I had made the biggest contribution to our TACAMO mission. I helped develop the "two-wire" orbit and worked hand-in-hand with John Hopkins Applied Physics Lab to set the orbit criteria for the new .160" wire. The fact that I could "talk engineering" stuff with the Collins Radio engineers doing the integration and if needed with Lockheed engineers was absolutely invaluable during this flight test development phase of the TACAMO IVB." (Author's note- IVB was the designation for the Collins proposed design bid for the two wire VLF program. Westinghouse's design bid was IVA.)

Understanding the two-wire orbit and the period of the possible YoYo was essential to making Verdin work dependably. For distant customers, a signal low at the wrong time could make a Verdin signal disappear and nobody would know it. Finally, Skipper Bill Coyne, extended Ed in VQ-4 because he had the most experience with the TACAMO IV aircraft/systems as well as the possible problems that might be encountered with TACAMO IV. Both VQ-4 and VQ-3 crews were trained by Ed and his crew, flying out of Bermuda in the transition to TACAMO IV. As Ed tells it: "I got to train all of our pilot instructors and flew all of the annual check rides. This was



truly a dream job for a pilot. I was also put in charge of the squadron's transition training of flight crews from TAC III to TAC IVB and I was again extended in the squadron by Skipper Bill Coyne." Truly these Skippers had found the right guy.

Ed tells what happened next. "When it came time to rotate Continued on Page 7

out of VQ-4, I thought about what I had experienced and witnessed about the way we developed and installed our new TACAMO modifications into our EC-130s. I knew that there had to be a better way and I was trying to figure it out but I knew that operational experienced people were necessary in the procurement and testing. At that time, the good people were bailing out of the Navy or cross decking to a warfare specialty since it appeared the temporary TACAMO was going the way of the dinosaurs. Having my feet planted firmly in the operational world of TACAMO as well as some TACAMO R&D projects I was involved in, I thought TACAMO was here to stay for the foreseeable future. I decided to take my chances with the TACAMO community and I thought about PG School as a way to help TACAMO of the future. I decided to ask for the Communications Engineering curriculum at Monterey to round out my background in engineering to be able to help TACAMO in the future if I had a chance. Communication Engineering was just an extension of my background in Electrical/Electronics Engineering with a lot of communications theory and technology emphasis. I went to Monterey."



Later NAVAIR needed someone to come to the PMA and hammer out what the replacement for the Hercs needed to have and again the VQ-4 Skipper, Frank Hilton, found the right guy and convinced his Maintenance Officer (Ed) to take the next EC platform, then called ECX, Class Desk job. That's essentially the lead engineer who had to ride herd on and defend

requirements to the Pentagon. He shepherded the requirements all the way up to the final critical design review before being transferred back to VQ-4 again. That third VQ-4 tour for Ed was his CO tour. And once again Ed was "the right guy" as he was finishing his own tour commanding VQ-4. NAVAIR needed an experienced TACAMO leader to lead the ECX to E-6A Mercury program. Ed was experiencing considerable pressure from flag officers he had served under in the carrier Navy. He was a shoo-in in for a carrier navigator and likely deep draft command and he knew it. Ed decided for TACAMO. Instead the deep draft to flag route, Ed led the TACAMO PMA in resolving development, testing, and fielding of the Merc. In his own words, TACAMO Hall of Fame plankowner Ed Hampshire: "During my last few months as CO, I was trying to figure out what I wanted to do next in the NAVY. It was either go back to the carriers as the ship's Navigator or transition into the then brand new Material Professional path of procurement. I absolutely hated the thought of going back into the Washington bureaucracy that I learned to hate as the Class Desk. I then revised my thinking and thought that I might get a chance

to again serve my TACAMO shipmates. Maybe I would get a chance to help improve their squadron operational lives if I took the procurement path which is what I (and Sherry) chose. After that, I soon found out that I had been "selected" to be the new PMA-271 by NAVAIR himself. I was beginning to wonder if I had a Guarding Angel looking out for me (maybe named VADM Booth). It looked as though my plan for my future service in the Navy that I had envisioned back in the early 70s in VQ-4 was coming to fruition. I spent years trying to groom myself as "the best qualified" person to serve as the TACAMO PMA should the opportunity arise and here it was. I chose the word "serve" on purpose because I felt like I was actually



serving our community and its personnel, not just doing a job for NAVAIR."

The Merc was built and has served well for the past 30-plus years. After Ed retired, he was followed by a succession P-3 community stars and three other TACAMO officers whose experiences and qualifications allowed them to improve the Merc. Dave Nordean was after Ed and immediately faced the challenge of crossdecking EC-135

gear and crews to create the E-6B ABNCP. The nTACAMO veteran John Ryan, not a skipper but an acquisition prolike Dave, kept the program office alive and



built a future roadmap for the E-6B and the Block 1 improvements. Then Bill Okoniewski came from command of VQ-3 where he led the E-6A to E-6B ABNCP transition. Bill faced production and funding problems with both the Block 1 and glass cockpit mods as well as creating a mission systems lab at Pax. And right behind Bill came another TACAMO star, Jay Gallamore from command of VQ-3. Jay faced taking jets out of service for heavy depot and a new contractor providing logistics parts. In 2008, after 3 TACAMO community-grown PMAs, there

Design Requirements:

- Drogue
- 25th Anniversary
- TACAMO Community Veterans Association
- Requirements
- Size: 1.75" or less.
- Small details may be lost due to the nature of coin making, so **don't** make super detailed designs.
- Colors on one or both sides. If your design requires fancy stuff like epoxy and special finishes then we can talk about that, but keep in mind that all of the extra features increase cost significantly.
- Solid colors only
- Nothing inappropriate in the design.
- We don't want to restrict anyone's creativity too much. It should be obviously apparent what community the challenge coin is representing.
- Clean and sharp hand-drawn designs are probably workable, but something done with a graphics program will be ideal. Require 300dpi graphics
- Submit as many designs as you like.
- If you aren't artistic, feel free to submit ideas and maybe someone else will draw it up.
- Due to the large setup costs for coins, only one design will be selected and produced
- Winner will have their design produced and win a polo shirt w/squadron logo (Example VQ-3) or letters and a ball cap with Squadron letters (Example VQ-3)
- All rights for the design will be handed over to TCVA. TCVA will produce a limited number of coins with winning design






were four P-3/S-3 community-sourced gents that led the PMA as the jets aged, the mods and maintenance impacting the flight line, and then COVID arrived. They kept things going, partnered with industry and the Wing, and ensured the Fleet had the jets to cover the mission.



And just as it came time for Captain Adam Scott to come in as the new PMA, the decision was made to recapitalize the aircraft and mission.







"Hi there. I served as an AT IFT in VQ4 2005-2007. Since that time 6 guys I knew took their own life. Most recently Will Caskey.

If anyone served with Will Caskey, they remember it. He left a lasting mark on everyone. He was a very generous guy. He always had someone living with him or crashing on his couch. He was a very bright tech. I remember he just seemed to have a great aptitude for avionics. He was a great golfer and we played so many rounds there on Tinker. I know so many people had great memories with him. We had fallen out of touch over the last few years but it was such a shock to hear he took his life. This makes 3 sailors I served with in the last 12 months who took their life. The night I heard about Will I was very moved and sat down to write this song. Michael Huffman and I served with Will in the same shop and Mike is a great musician. We sat down and spent a few hours working on this song in the studio and Will's song is the result. Such a tough thing to write about but I wanted to share it. I hope this helps someone out there."


